#### Last month's events:

- Mike Brorson went to 4 day snow cat training and has a lot of information to pass on. He
  learned a lot about how to fix a snowcat, the capabilities of the snow cat, and of course how to
  drive a snowcat on all kinds of terrain. If you have interest in being trained on the snow cat,

- MRA Recert: The team went down to the Barstow area for the annual CA MRA recert. This year was a search and tracking event and the team passed with flying colors. Although it took us a while to find our subject and we had some communication issues. We did an excellent job on medical with special thanks to Dave, in IC we had some challenges with overlapping with the different teams and hints that were difficult but pulled it off well in the end. Overall we had a good day and did well and pulled off a pretty well-run search. But we definitely got a lot out of the process of training. Important take homes: make sure you're updating your coordinates with base as much as possible and leave the keys on the vehicle.
- Our sole pseudo mission of the month: "Body" recovery in PV reservoir. After the team pulled the dead mice out of the Zodiac, figured out how to inflate it, filled up the flat and rotted tires on the trailer, it was determined by Nate that the body was actually just a float tube.
- Training: Buttermilks twin tension system raise and lower: We had to build a number of redirects and the anchors were in very different locations. Overall it worked really well, it took a long time to set up, but mostly because we were taking our time and teaching. We could as always have improved our communication with the patient so that she knew when she was being raised.
- **Banff Mountain Film Festival** went well—we made a fair bit of money thanks to the silent auction, but next time we'll know a lot more about it and will have a much better auction.
