- Recert: 16 slots, in Joshua Tree at Indian Cove. Will people want to spend both Friday and Saturday night?
 - Do we need to provide proctors? Julie volunteers to be a proctor.

Max is going to look into a few different options. We did all this a few years ago and decided to stick with Calling Post. It is possible the county might give us Mission Manager for free, which would be great, but if not, we should look into alternatives. Text capability would be great for our team, especially if you can see who is going. Julia is going to follow up with Rachel. Calling Post also has a deluxe 12 cent edition with additional features.
- Google Docs is a mess. Should we just find a completely different service that is easier to use and share?
