Nate would like us to come together and come up with ideas for what we want from the deputies in both the short and long term.

Missions: Meyson Lakes, Mike Myers search: 11/18: Team was contacted that he'd been missing since the 4th they had only been looking for him and his vehicle for 3 days. Vehicle finally found on a service road in a gray car off the S curve--not easily located. Luckily he left a note said he was going to do Irvine, Mallory, LeConte

Day 1: 11/19: Matt and Mike made it up to Meyson Lk and were able to glass but it was really windy and weren't able to get a lot of ground covered

Day 2: Chinook (helicopter--not salmon) and 4 teams were called in and divided up into search areas. Julie and crew in Chinook were able to see stocking cap and helmet near avi debris. Day 3: Search dogs and teams and Mammoth brought in their rico device 50 people put in the field that day and were able to locate him quickly and recover the body. It was very wind scoured up there and was difficult to see any tracks. He was carried by the debris and was right at the toe of the debris. No other avalanche activity noted during flyovers. Serious trauma on the subject.

Lessons: First avi death in the US this season. Interesting that the slide occurred in such a low amount of snow.

Funeral Mtn. Mission: Geologist was scrambling around and found human remains at the base of the Furnace Crk range, almost on the Nevada border.

Deputy determined it would take technical equip to recover the remains which were partly in a cave near some cliffs. There was 18-20' of exposure off the ledge, but the deputy had gone out and gotten some of the remains, but didn't get all of them. Person had been missing since 1996. Found with a bullet through the skull and an old fashioned pirate pistol with a single discharge. Technical equipment wasn't needed.
